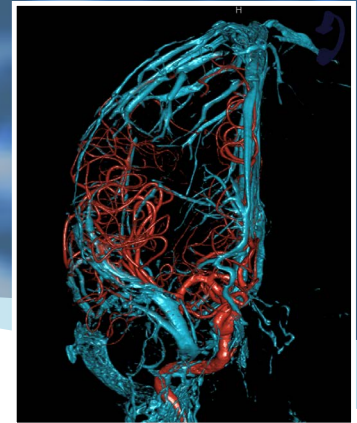

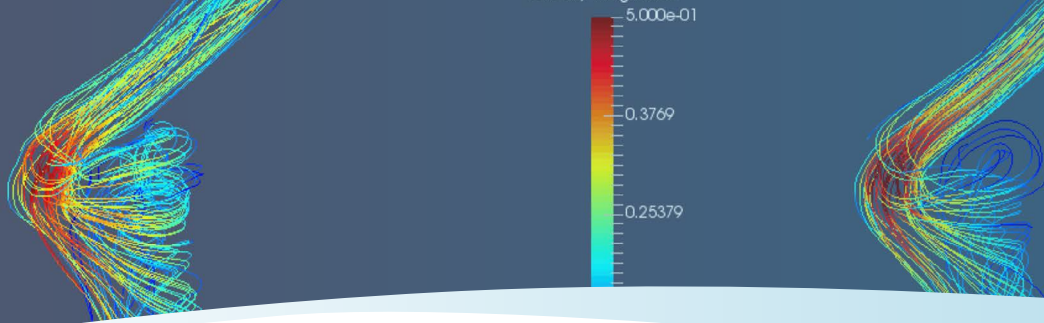

Authors are invited to submit abstracts including case reports, new concepts, new diseases or disease mechanisms, novel therapies, novel or advanced imaging, anatomy descriptions, trial proposals, or any other items that the authors believe to be relevant to the below categories.

Submission topic areas are:

- Intracranial Venous Diseases
- CSF Leak/Hypotension
- Emerging Venous Diseases or Therapies



ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

Please send your abstract to Marie Williams Denslow at williams@snisonline.org by Monday, February 3, 2025. Authors are encouraged to submit abstracts early.

PRESENTATION CATEGORIES

NOTE: All abstracts will be accepted, but ordered for presentation by the program committee. Abstracts will be used to generate discussion among the attendees, so authors should be prepared to discuss their work. Scientific discussion and discourse are key for developing this field, and will be prioritized. As such, there may not be sufficient time for all abstracts to be presented.

Abstracts should describe the point or points to be discussed or learned by the attendees after hearing the presentation.

Scientific Paper (Oral Presentation)

An oral presentation (5 minutes in length) that summarizes the details of the research, case(s), concepts, or trial to be discussed. Required abstract format: Introduction/Purpose, Materials/Methods or Case, Results or Alternate Approaches if a case report, Conclusion.

Scientific Paper abstracts may include one graphic file with a maximum of two images.

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

Abstract Submission Criteria

Text:

1. Submit abstract in one category only.
2. Format abstract text using headings required for submission category.
3. Maximum length: 500 words; Graphic file equals 100 words; Table equals 50 words.

Graphics – For each abstract submitted:

1. Only one graphic file with a maximum of two images is permitted.
2. Required Graphic file resolution is 300 dpi or greater.
3. Maximum size of printed file is 3 in. by 3 in.

Note: A submitted graphic that is larger than the required size will be reduced accordingly, which may significantly reduce the quality of the graphic.

4. Only jpg or gif formats are accepted online.

Important Information for All Abstract Submissions

1. Presenters of accepted abstracts must register for the SNIS Cerebral Venous & CSF Disorders Summit. Registration fees are required and not waived with acceptance.
2. Oral papers must be presented in digital format uploaded to our meeting server if accepted. (No personal PC or Mac may be used from the podium).

ABSTRACT DISPOSITION NOTIFICATION

All abstracts will be automatically accepted, but each will be peer-reviewed and ranked for priority of presentation during the second half of each day.

Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) Compliance

Members of the SNIS Program Committee attend every presentation to monitor HIPAA compliance.

Any such relationship must be disclosed.
