JNIS was founded in 2009 and has become one of the premier neuroscience journals with a current impact factor of 4.5. The journal is owned by SNIS and published by BMJ.




Applicants with primary training backgrounds in interventional neuroradiology, endovascular neurosurgery or interventional neurology who are senior members of SNIS and have a recognized expertise in the field of neurointerventional surgery are welcome. Successful applicants should have a vision for advancing the scientific and international reputation of JNIS while maintaining the relevance of the journal to practicing neurointerventionalists worldwide.



Full editorial support and training will be provided. The editor-in-chief should expect to spend the equivalent of up to one day in total each week on journal-related activities. The successful applicant will be free to select his/her own team of Associate Editors and Editorial Board members.



Closing date for applications is April 18, 2025. Interviews will be held in Spring 2025. We envision that the successful candidate will officially take up post in August 2025, following a hand-over period with the current Editor-in-Chief. The potentially renewable term of office is 5 years.
