

- Emerging Venous Diseases or Therapies



## PRESENTATION CATEGORY

**NOTE:** Abstracts will be used to generate discussion among the attendees, so authors should be prepared to discuss their work. Scientific discussion and discourse are key for developing this field and will be prioritized. Abstracts should describe the point or points to be discussed or learned by the attendees after hearing the presentation. Abstract disposition notification will be sent via email in February 2026 following peer review. The highest scoring abstracts will be accepted for presentation.

### Scientific Paper (*Oral Presentation*)

An oral presentation (3-5 minutes in length) that summarizes the details of the research, case(s), concepts, or trial to be discussed. Required abstract format: Introduction/Purpose, Materials/Methods or Case, Results or Alternate Approaches if a case report, Conclusion.

*Scientific Paper abstracts may include one graphic file with a maximum of two images.*

## ABSTRACT SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

### Abstract Submission Criteria

1. Submit abstract in one category only.
2. Format abstract text using headings required for submission category.
3. Maximum length: 500 words; Graphic file equals 100 words; Table equals 50 words.
4. Maximum of two (2) graphics/tables are permitted.
5. Only jpg or gif formats are accepted online. Required graphic file resolution is 300 dpi or greater.

### Important Information for All Abstract Submissions

1. Presenters of accepted abstracts must register for the SNIS Cerebral Venous & CSF Disorders Summit. Registration fees are required and not waived with acceptance.
2. Oral papers must be presented in digital format uploaded to our meeting server if accepted. (No personal PC or Mac may be used from the podium).
